

Kaskaskia College Curriculum Guide Towards a Bachelor of Science  
Degree for Southern Illinois University Carbondale –  
**Online Degree Option**

**Transfer Curriculum • Associate in Arts Degree • Minimum 2.0 GPA • Minimum 66 Credit Hours**

This is a common general educational transfer curriculum for this Southern Illinois University Carbondale Online degree completion program for Business Administration. See a college counselor for professional guidance. Admission requirements for the program include a minimum 2.0 GPA, the bolded lower level business courses, and completion of one of the following: SIUC core curriculum, Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) general education core, or an Associate in Arts or Associate in Science from an Illinois community college. Kaskaskia College students must complete at least **66 credit hours** in order to meet the 50% rule in the College of Business – 50% of a student's coursework must come from outside the business area. This suggested guide has a minimum of 64 hours and a potential of 69. Students must complete 60 hours of non-business coursework at Kaskaskia.

**Graduation Requirements of the AA degree from Kaskaskia:**

RESPONSIBILITY OF STUDENT: It is the responsibility of the student to know and observe the requirements of his/her curriculum and the rules governing academic work. The Associate in Arts degree is at least 64 hours of transfer eligible courses. A student must maintain at least a G.P.A. of 2.0 ("C"). Please refer to Graduation Requirements and Procedures of current KC Catalog. Students will not be denied admission due to deficiencies in high school work, but must satisfy these deficiencies before graduation from Kaskaskia College.

Students must successfully complete one of the following courses to meet requirements of Public Act 87-581 in order to graduate: PHLE 120, PHLE 121, POLS 101, PSYH 101, SOCO 101 or BUSN 134.

**Southern Illinois University Carbondale Information:**

The Business Administration Degree Completion program at Southern Illinois University Carbondale only requires an additional 60 hours of junior and senior level course work in order to complete a bachelor of science degree from an **AACSB accredited** program. The AACSB accreditation is the *highest* standard of achievement for a business school, world-wide. Many employers look for graduates from an AACSB program, because they have graduated from a *quality* program. SIUC College of Business is in the **top 10%** of public colleges of business in the nation.

Students must apply to the University to the Business and Administration (BNAD) program. Courses are taught in 'content areas' during a traditional semester, which include two-eight week classes during the traditional 16 week term. Students may start the program in January, May, or December. The program is eligible for financial aid. Student services, including academic advisement and career placement, are available.
